
# MISHKAN 5782 YEARS OF PURPOSE, CONNECTION, AND INSPIRATION



Ten years ago, we founded Mishkan Chicago with a vision for Judaism that would speak to the next generation: spiritually exciting, socially diverse, musically uplifting, intellectually rigorous, and radically inclusive. I still remember our first Shabbat service in September 2011. It was 65 strangers brought together by an email that promised a night of meaningful prayer, learning and dinner. By the end of the evening, our singing, conversation and laughter could be heard down the block... and a community was born. A decade later, our venues may be larger than the average living room, but creating Jewish spiritual space

where you can bring your whole self and be part of something larger than yourself – remains our essence.



Jews see themselves and find home – atheists, agnostics and believers, LGBTQ+ folks, interfaith couples and families, people of color, people with disabilities, seekers and scholars, Jewish camp alums and people who never went to camp, Jewish-adjacent people, and "just Jewish" folks. The Mishkan in the Torah was radically inclusive – that's our aim, too.

The High Holidays are always an invitation for reflection and recommitment to the places, people and issues that matter most in our lives, and this past year has had no shortage of major world and local events to process. This Rosh Hashanah marks the start of a *shmitah* year – a "year of release" or sabbatical year, the time on the Jewish calendar every seven years that asks us to reconsider our relationships with each other and the earth. With that in mind, we plan to spend this year asking big questions that will help us better serve our growing community. In this next chapter, how can we meet you where you are – both in person and virtually – and bring you into more meaningful, inspiring and transformational Jewish experiences?

I am beyond proud that this is our Mishkan. This year more than ever before – we are so glad you are here.

# A Decade of Inspiration



#### **RAISING MENSCHES**

Mensch Academy started as a pilot project of 15 students in 2014 and has now grown into an innovative and award-winning program serving students from ages 3–13. This fall, we will welcome 100 students including 13 teens who will become BMitzvah. New this year, we're launching Mensch University, a teen leadership program for our Mensch alumni.



#### **OUR GROWING STAFF**

Mishkan's early days began with zero paid staff and has grown to include fourteen fulltime and six part-time employees that help us serve our diverse and growing community. From family programs to adult learning to

justice work to Shabbat to the High Holidays and everything in between, our rockstar staff serves more than 4,500 people annually.





#### HIGHER HOLIDAYS, MORE INSPIRATION

We held our first High Holidays in 2012 at the Bodhi Spiritual Center (may its memory be a blessing) and as we grew, so did our venues. After three years at Bodhi, we moved to the Preston Bradley Center in Uptown, the Vic Theatre in Lakeview, and last year, virtually, where more than 2,700 of you tuned in for High



Holiday inspiration. This year, we're gathering for four incredible days of fresh air, music, and prayer at the Chicago History Museum.



#### GOOD SHABBOS, WEEKLY

Back in 2011, Mishkan held two services a month and books were couriered from location to location via Rabbi Lizzi's 2003 Honda Civic Hybrid. Fast forward to today, and our Shabbat services see more than 200 people in locations across Chicago with hundreds more tuning in

to the live-stream each week. In the year ahead, we'll offer weekly Shabbat services led by Rabbis Lizzi, Deena, Steven, and our Davening Team.





#### A RABBINIC TRAINING GROUND

It turns out that inspired, down-to-earth Judaism also creates inspired, down-to-earth rabbis. Over the last decade, through our Leadership Fellowship, the Jewish Emergent Network Rabbinic Fellowship, and simply by encouraging young talent, we have seen thirteen community members (that we know of!) go on to Rabbinic School and serve as Rabbis out in the world (not to mention the ones who come back!).







#### **MAKING OUR MARK**

Our SoundCloud featuring music by the Davening Team has seen over 200,000 listens, our two podcasts, Contact Chai and The Morning Scroll, have received over 16,000 listens, and more than one-third of our live-stream viewership tunes in from out-of-state. Mishkan has not only grown in size but in reputation, and our staff regularly provides guidance and mentorship to Jewish communities all over the world.









## Our Impact

We believe that a budget is an expression of values. At Mishkan, we invest in talented people, meaningful programs and spaces to gather – and that's it! Our budget, and all the money raised to meet it, directly supports Mishkan's work engaging, educating and inspiring our community.

In 2021, our budget is \$2,000,000, which we raise through a combination of ticketing, Buildership, tuition, foundation grants, and donations large and small. Just as in the ancient Mishkan, every contribution counts, and no one is turned away for lack of funds.

This year, in addition to weekly Shabbat services in person and online, the full Jewish calendar of holidays, lifecycle events, child and adult learning, staff-supported small groups and classes, and more programs than ever, our budget and resources will support:

- You! We subsidize more than \$80,000 annually in Buildership fees, programs, and tuition for our community members.
- High-quality virtual access to High Holidays, Shabbat and programs throughout the year
- This year's High Holy Fest: four days of fresh air, music, prayer, and high holy inspiration at the Chicago History Museum.
- Investment in our staff. This year four new full-time staff members join our team including two full-time family educators and a third rabbi.
- A renewed commitment to anti-racism and to Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion, through training and resources for our staff and community. We will continue to aspire toward transparent, equitable, and explicitly anti-racist hiring and compensation practices with a commitment to bringing multi-talented and diverse voices to our team.
