Therefore say to the people of Israel, "I am the Lord, and I will bring you out from under the burdens of the Egyptians, and I will rid you from their slavery, and I will redeem you with a outstretched arm, and with great judgments, and I will take you to me for a people, and I will be to you God, and you shall know that I am the Lord your God, who brings you out from under the burdens of the Egyptians. And I will bring you in to the land, which I swore to give it to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob, and I will give it to you for a heritage, I am the Lord!"
