Event Perfect Endings Aren't Perfect

12 And Eliezer said, "O Lord, God of my master Abraham, I beg you, send me good speed this day, and show kindness to my master Abraham. Behold, I stand here by the well of water, and the daughters of the people of the city come out to draw water, let it come to pass that when the girl to whom I shall say, 'Let down your water jar, I beg you, that I may drink," then she shall say, "Drink, and I will give your camels water also." Let the same be she whom you have appointed for your servant Isaac, and thereby shall I know that you have shown kindness to my master. 15 And it came to pass, before he had finished speaking, that, behold, Rebekah came out...
