TORAH: 6 Therefore say to the people of Israel, 'I am the Lord, and I will bring you out from under the burdens of the Egyptians, and I will rid you from their slavery, and I will redeem you with a outstretched arm, and with great judgments; 7 And I will take you to me for a people, and I will be to you a God; and you shall know that I am the Lord your God, who brings you out from under the burdens of the Egyptians. 8 And I will bring you in to the land, concerning which I swore to give it to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob; and I will give it to you for a heritage; I am the Lord."

9 And Moses spoke thus to the people of Israel– but they didn't listened to Moses because of kotser ruach– shortness of spirit, and because of the difficult work. And the Lord spoke to Moses, saying, 11 "Go, speak to Pharaoh king of Egypt, that he let the people of Israel go out of his land." And Moses spoke before the Lord, saying, "See, the people of Israel have not listened to me! How then shall Pharaoh hear me, who has blocked lips?"

13 And the Lord spoke to Moses and to Aaron, and commanded them regarding the children of Israel, and regarding Pharaoh king of Egypt, to bring the people of Israel out of the land of Egypt. Shemot/Exodus 6:5-13

RASHI: God spoke to Moses and Aaron. Because Moses said, "I have blocked lips, the Holy One, Blessed be God, had Aaron join him to be a mouthpiece and intermediary for him.

And he commanded them regarding the children of Israel. He commanded Moses and Aaron [concerning the Children of Israel] to lead them calmly, to be patient with them. He commanded them concerning Pharaoh, to accord honor to him with their words.
