TORAH: Remember what Amalek did unto thee by the way as you came out of Egypt; how he met you on the road, and struck those of you at the back, all that were weak in thy rear, when you were tired and worn down— and he did not fear G!d. **19** Therefore it shall be, when G!d gives you rest from all your enemies around you, in the land which the LORD thy G!d gives you for an inheritance to possess it, that you shalt blot out the memory of Amalek from under heaven. Do not forget!

MISHNA: A man may neither go out on Shabbat with a sword, nor with a bow, nor with a shield, nor with an alla, nor with a spear. And if he unwittingly went out with one of these weapons to the public domain he is liable to bring a sin-offering. Rabbi Eliezer says: These weapons are ornaments for him—so just as a person is permitted to go out into the public domain with other ornaments, he is permitted to go out with weapons. And the Rabbis say: They are nothing other than reprehensible and in the future they will be eliminated, as it is written: "And they shall beat their swords into plowshares and their spears into pruning hooks; nation will not raise sword against nation, neither will they learn war anymore" (Isaiah 2:4). – Mishnah Shabbat 63a

TALMUD: Rabba and Rabbi Zeira prepared a Purim feast with each other, and they became drunk to the point that Rabba arose and slaughtered Rabbi Zeira. The next day, when he became sober and realized what he had done, Rabba asked God for mercy, and revived him. The next year, Rabba said to Rabbi Zeira: Let the Master come and let us prepare the Purim feast with each other. He said to him: Miracles do not happen each and every hour, and I do not want to undergo that experience again. - Talmud Bavli Megilla 7b
